There is a reason why CAIF’s Review of 2023 is fronted this year by a representation of *Artificial Intelligence*, as we came into contact with this new technology in a controversial, and expensive, way in 2023.

We fell victim of a ‘bot’, a device which crawls through the archives of the internet, searching through everything that exists there and tracing the use of any image published by an original owner but which has been downloaded and used by another party.

Once an owner/organization finds an image on your server, they may send a demand letter for payment for breach of copyright, even if the usage has been made in a quite innocent, non-commercial way.

This is what happened to CAIF and it cost us hundreds of £££s for what was claimed to have been unauthorized “use” of a small number of images, most of which related to the city of Mosul, a city in Iraq for which CAIF has been supporting its restoration following the years of destruction which culminated in the battle to take it back from the murderous clutches of ISIS.

One might wonder why the multi-national photo agencies would want to insist on their copyright income against our noble intentions of bringing the story of Mosul’s suffering to the attention of a wider audience through publication on our website, but, unfortunately, such is the mercenary world in which we all have to live today.

We have no issue with the original owners of the images – the several photographers whose work we used – but we doubt very much whether they will benefit from our payments.




There was a catastrophic earthquake in Turkey and Syria on 18th February. CAIF made a donation to the appeal.


We also welcomed Reinhard Pontius from Dresden, once again, as he came to collect the 'Angel, Michael', to transport it to Cornwall.



"Lessons from Genocide Twenty Nine years on"




Marc Gwamaka, from Rwanda, spoke on this topic, giving a different perspective than the one promoted by the West.
